Charter member Bob Mingus became the first Dunwoody Rotarian to receive a Paul Harris Fellow for Polio. PDG Robert and Charlene Hall, Roy Wise and Past President Laura Kann have all participated in National Immunization Days in India, And last year. thanks to the generosity of our members, we raised \$40,000 and took our total giving on behalf of Polio to more than \$150,000.

Last Friday, President Rick announced our 2019 Polio Plus campaign - with our goal of raising \$25,000. This aligns with the second year of Rotary's three-year Polio campaign to help get across the finish line with Polio eradication. He has asked that all members consider donating at least \$100 so that we can quickly and easily reach our goal.
