THIS WEEK'S PRGRAM AT GRIFFIN ROTARY Libraries Are Not Defunct Dinosaurs



Chantel Dunham, Director of Development for the University of Georgia Libraries, certainly dispelled any speculation that libraries are outdated and defunct with our ready access to information through the worldwide web. The UGA Libraries make up the largest library system in Georgia with four libraries on the main UGA Campus in Athens and several other UGA sites across the state. Approximately 5 million volumes of books as well as maps, photographs, and other historical documents and information are housed within these libraries. On the main campus, the Miller Learning Center has a library that is used by 5000 students and serves as a hub of activities with 25 classrooms and an electronic library. It was and is designed to accommodate the way today's students learn. The Science Library on the South Campus serves approximately 600 students and supports collections for research and instruction in the physical and life

sciences. The Hargrett Library in the Russell Special Collections Building has over 30,000 ft² feet of vaults maintained at 50°F and 30% relative humidity to carefully preserve rare books, historical documents, photographs, maps, archives, and records. Holdings date back to the 15th Century. A political library is also housed in the Russell Building with a collection of Richard B. Russell's works. Many others works are stored there on various subjects including colonial history, Native American history, the largest collection of John Abbot's works on insects in Georgia, and even the Walter J. Brown Media Archives & Peabody Awards Collection. Much more is there, and you are encouraged to go online to learn more (www.libs.uga.edu).
